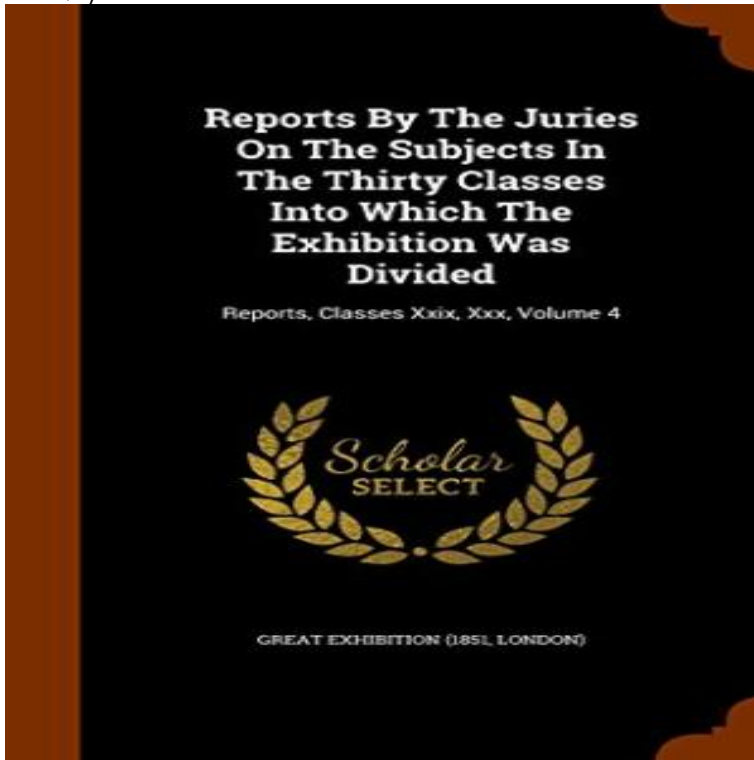


Livy XXIX
